



NEED 9-1-1?

CALL IF YOU CAN. TEXT IF YOU CAN'T.

**Text-to-911 is now available in
Columbia and Montour Counties of PA.**

If you need help, but can't safely speak on the phone or are unable to speak, use your mobile phone to send a text message to 9-1-1.

How to text 9-1-1 in an emergency:

1. Create a new text message - ***Do not text and drive!***
2. Enter the numbers "911" in the "To:" field;
3. Type a brief message in the "Message:" field, containing the location and type of emergency.
4. Push "Send," and wait for a response. Be prepared to answer questions and follow instructions from the 9-1-1 call taker.


Additional Text-to-911 information:

- ◇ ***Voice calls are still the best and fastest way to contact 9-1-1.***
- ◇ As with all text messages, 9-1-1 messages can take longer to receive, can get out of order, or may not be received at all.
- ◇ Text in simple words - do not use abbreviations, slang, or emojis.
- ◇ Do not send photos or videos; multimedia messages cannot be received at this time.
- ◇ Keep text messages brief and concise.
- ◇ Text-to-911 messages cannot include more than one person (group messages). Do not send your emergency text to anyone other than 9-1-1.
- ◇ Text location information is not equal to current 9-1-1 call location technology.
- ◇ Text-to-911 is not available everywhere, and is not always available when roaming.
- ◇ ***It is a crime to text or call 9-1-1 with a false report. Prank-texters can be located, and may be prosecuted.***

When to use Text-to-911:



If you're deaf, hard-of-hearing,
or unable to speak.



If you're in a situation where it's
not safe to call 9-1-1 for help.



If you're having a medical
emergency and cannot speak
on the phone.
